The Early Days Of The Valley Forge Region

Continuing the story of The Birth Of A Region — 50 Years Ago This Year The Region Was Formed.

Milestones in the first 25 years:

- ◆ 1975 - The Valley Forge Region was formed by Lew Howells
- ◆ 1976-1979 - The Goddess was established, first annual banquet and club picnics
- ◆ 1980-1982 - Judging classes were organized, activities sponsored by Don Rosen Cadillac, club established as a nonprofit corporation
- ◆ 1983-1985 - Dealer shows held at Armen Cadillac (Conshohocken, PA) and Colonial Cadillac (Trenton, NJ), VFR hosted the CLC Grand National with 140 car attending
- ◆ 1986-1987 - The club sponsored a charity event for Abington Memorial Hospital, dealer show at Kelly Cadillac (Lancaster, PA), VFR membership exceeds 150 and the board increased to twelve
- ◆ 1988-1991- Associate Membership (\$5) created to encourage spouses participation, dealer show at Brenner Cadillac (Harrisburg, PA), dealer sponsorship fee increased to \$1,000, membership now at 280
- ◆ 1992-1994 - First bi-regional meet by the VFR and the Potomac Region, Dealer shows at Brenner, Cown, DeSimone, Kelly and Winner Cadillac, VFR hosted 2nd CLC Grand National with 289 car attending
- ◆ 1995-1997 - Cadillac Motor Division donated \$2,500 to VFR for participation in a *Cadillac Challenge* at NJ's Garden State Race Track, a run to the Fleetwood Body Co. celebrating 50 years of the 1947 Cadillac
- ◆ 1998-2000 - Custom VFR jackets available, 2/7/99 *The Sunday Inquirer* featured an article on VFR's banquet with Bud and Barbara Coleman next to their Cadillacs, Club began year long 25th anniversary celebration with many events and shows

My First Classic Car: A 1968 Cadillac

I grew up riding in and eventually driving my father's Cadillacs. From his first, a 1967 Coupe deVille to his last, a 2008 DTS. In between were five Fleetwoods of various model years, a '79 Seville, an '83 Eldorado, Broughams, Sedan deVilles... At one point, the family had three Fleetwood Broughams sitting in the driveway. I learned to drive in Dad's '76 Fleetwood Brougham... Firethorn over red leather with a white vinyl top. He, and several work colleagues purchased '76 Cadillacs when GM announced they were downsizing *all* their makes & models in 1977. The '76 Fleetwood technically was my first car, if only in title. It would be twenty years before I could purchase one of Dad's hand-me-downs on my own (no family discount).

Dad would trade in or sell his cars every three-to-five years. They were in his words "cream puffs" – low mileage, well-maintained examples. I bought his 2002 DeVille DHS in 2008; then I bought his 2008 DTS in 2012 when he could no longer drive. These proved to be comfortable, reliable, daily family drivers which we enjoyed for years, until my attention turned to more sport-oriented drivers, a full-size SUV, and antique cars.



I embarked on the collector car journey in 2016. I decided my first (and only?) classic car would be a Cadillac (what else!?). I knew *nothing* about owning or maintaining a 20+ year-old car, except that I should have a prospective car inspected prior to purchasing, if not by myself, then by someone to assess condition prior to purchase. I passed on a few prospects, inspections of which suggested a lot of work was needed. After a year-long search (mostly online) and growing *impatient*,



I found a 1968 DeVille convertible on eBay that “presented” well. Think “lipstick on a pig.” Looks can be deceiving, especially on the internet, of a car in Nevada when you are on the east coast. I hired a pre-purchase inspection service. The report came back; the only finding that raised a flag was “...mild-to moderate rust.” “What does that mean?” I asked the inspector. “Oh, just surface rust on the frame and floorboards” he replied. “Is the frame solid?” “Oh yes, the frame is solid.” Upon delivery, the first trip was to my trusted mechanic for a thorough inspection. That was when I got *the phone call*, like a call from the doctor when you go complaining of a mysterious pain... “I need to see you in the shop” he said in his Marlboro-grizzled voice. Upon arriving, he showed me on the lift that 12-15 inches of box channel frame was disintegrating. The reason the inspector missed this was that someone had injected expanding foam insulation into the box frame and spray-painted it black.





This was the most heart-wrenching of several mechanical repairs performed over a four year "relationship." This was the car I "cut my teeth" with; I spent waaay too much money getting it to be a reliable, *safe*, occasional driver. Once it was sorted mechanically, the 20+ year-old paint & body work needed attention, along with electrical, suspension, interior, A/C, and other issues. As much as I enjoyed the car, I did not want to invest an estimated 3x the car's market value; so, I cut bait and sold it at a loss.

A Cadillac You Can Live In






Classic Cadillacs - Time To Share by Richard Taylor

Cadillac in France - Then and Now

One might say Cadillac was born in France. The town of Cadillac-sur-Garonne in south western France, as some historians believe, was where Antoine de Lamothe Cadillac drew inspiration for his name. Legend has it that this famous French explorer, who founded the city of Detroit, the home of General Motors, was born Antoine Laumet in Saint-Nicolas-de-la-Grave, Gascony but adopted the name of Cadillac to become Seigneur de Cadillac. Then, in 1902, Henry M. Leland decided to pay homage to this historical French figure by founding the Cadillac brand. Antoine's coat of arms even provided inspiration for the Cadillac logo.

Even some of the names Cadillac used for its vehicles were of French origin. The Eldorado **Biarritz** is named after the elegant French Atlantic coastal town of Biarritz. **Deville** is a small town in northern France. Believe it or not the surname "LaSalle" (or Lassalle) originates from French, meaning "the hall" or "large room".



During World War I, Cadillac vehicles, particularly the Type 57, a seven-passenger touring car, was chosen as

the official vehicle for military officers due to its durability and speed. They were used by the American Expeditionary Forces (A.E.F.) in France, with one surviving Cadillac, chassis US1257X, now known as the "Liberty Cadillac," serving as a support vehicle with a documented service record from WWI. The car served in France from 1917 to 1919, including during the Second Battle of the Marne, and has a bullet hole in its left front fender, possibly from a German sniper or strafing aircraft. *An article from Hemmings can be found here: [Liberty Cadillac](#)*

In June of 1930, the *Cadillac Motor Car Division* of GM sent five of its sixteen-cylinder models to Europe, on a promotional "Tour". After arriving on board the "SS United States", the "Tour" begun in Paris, on June 21, 1930. The five

cars received temporary French license tags they bore throughout the duration of the "Tour". All the "tour" cars carried French "tourist" license tags with the suffix "XB".

Records show that during the ten weeks in Europe the cars were shown at 21 formal views, 44 different cities were visited and 9 countries.

The cars had driven 10,709 km (6,650 miles) in total, from Copenhagen to Paris.

V-16 CARAVAN TO TOUR EUROPE

To afford motorists in every large city in Europe an opportunity to inspect the Cadillac V-16, America's first Six-Cylinder automobile, a caravan of five of these cars will tour Great Britain and the Continent during the summer months. It is announced.

The caravan will be in charge of T. W. Henderson, Manager of Cadillac-Lafayette sales for the General Motors Export Company, and George Carroll, European Cadillac-Lafayette Specialist and will consist of a five-passenger car for a seven-passenger Imperial, a Town Sedan, a Phantom and a Convertible Coupe. Four of the cars will go on display in the dealer's showroom while the caravan halts in his city and the fifth will be used as a demonstrator.

European interest in the Cadillac V-16 has been marked ever since it was announced, since no car of its exact type has ever been displayed there. Many European motorists have purchased Cadillac V-16's for their personal use and this adds to the interest with which they will be viewed.

The cars for the caravan will leave New York June 15th, on the S. S. France. The itinerary begins at Paris; the date June 21st. From there until September 25th it will visit:

During WWII Cadillac built the M5 Stuart tanks and M5A1 Stuart tanks all using the Cadillac 346 cubic inch V8 engine. The M5A1 Stuart light tank saw action in France during World War II, particularly in September 1944, where it was used by units like the 37th Tank Battalion, 4th Armored Division.



Over the years, GM exported Cadillacs to France in limited numbers. To take advantage for the push for electric vehicles by the European Union, in May 2024, Cadillac launched its flagship European EV store, **Cadillac City Paris**. This "Experience Center" in the heart of Paris, serves as a strategic hub for promoting Cadillac's new all-electric lineup to European audiences. The two-level store highlights the brand's luxury design, craftsmanship, and advanced technology.



The first level features a showroom displaying Cadillac's latest electric models, including the [Cadillac Lyriq](#) and the [Cadillac Optiq](#) electric vehicles.



The second floor or mezzanine level of **Cadillac City Paris** is divided into a lounge areas, a private consultation room and a play area with automotive-themed digital games to keep the kids entertained. Also, it is adorned by a scale clay model of the Cadillac Lyriq that highlights its sculptural design plus a vehicle customization area with fabric and color samples. Throughout the store there are displays paying homage to Cadillac's designs over the years.



In addition to Paris, there are currently Cadillac City Stores in Zurich, Hamburg, Frankfurt and Berlin with more stores opening soon in Sweden and France.

Valley Forge Region CLC Covered Bridge Run: *May 17, 2025*

Modern Cars Welcome! - Last Chance to Sign Up!

Bring your classic or modern car and friends for a scenic covered bridge run through southern Chester County, PA. During the drive, we'll visit four picturesque covered bridges in the stunning Brandywine Valley. Invite your friends and family to join us. This run is a modified version the Brandywine AACA region did last year.

After the drive, we invite you to join us for lunch (on your own) at Two Stones Pub <https://twostonespub.com/kennett-square/> in Kennett Square, PA. While you're in the area, take some time to explore nearby attractions such as Longwood Gardens, The Brandywine Museum of Art, The Brandywine Battlefield or the many charming antique shops in the region. It's the perfect way to enjoy the beauty and history of this unique area!

Starting Point: Northbrook Marketplace

Address: 1805 Unionville Wawaset Rd, West Chester, PA 19382

Northbrook Marketplace is located at the corner of Rt. 842 and Northbrook Road in West Chester, PA.


Arrival Time: Please plan to arrive at 9:30 AM. Arriving early allows time to use the restrooms (note: there will be two opportunities to stop for restroom facilities during the drive), grab a cup of coffee, and chat with fellow club members before we begin the drive. We aim to depart promptly at 10:00 AM after a group photo.

The Drive: Our route covers 55 scenic miles, taking us by four beautiful covered bridges, with an optional lunch stop at the end. The drive is expected to take just under two hours, but it may extend longer depending on conditions. **Important Considerations:** The route includes back country roads with limited shoulders, so please take this into account when deciding whether to join and which car to drive.

Our first bridge will be the **Gibson-Harmony Hill Bridge** outside of Marshallton, PA. It was built in 1872 by Edward Hall and Thomas Schull. It's a 78-foot-long Burr truss bridge. This is the only covered bridge remaining over the Brandywine Creek crossing, over the east branch of the Creek.



Our second bridge will be the **Speakman Bridge #1**; there is a Speakman #2 bridge, but it's on private property. Our bridge resides outside of Coatesville, originally constructed in 1881. The bridge at one time served the Johnathan Speakman gristmill, thus the name. It is 75 feet long and has a Burr arch truss design.



Our next bridge will be the **Linton Stevens Bridge** 1051 Kings Row Rd, Oxford, PA. The County built an iron bridge here in 1875. This was so damaged by the June 26, 1884 flood that J. Denithorne & Son were paid \$1,294.00 for repairing it. Only two years later a wooden covered bridge replaced the iron bridge. The bridge was named for Linton Stephens, a local postmaster. Chester County bridge maintenance records show an unexplained change of the spelling to Stevens in 1914.



Driving south on Kings Row Road we head to **Glen Hope Covered Bridge**, the last and most southern bridge on the tour. The bridge is located only ½ mile from the Mason-Dixon Line; the border between Maryland and Pennsylvania. It is a 65-foot-long Burr truss bridge, constructed in 1889 and spans the Little Elk Creek. It has vertical planking and eave-level window openings.



Our ride formally ends here. If you would like to join us, we head to the village of Kennett Square, PA where we gather for an optional lunch on your own at the **Two Stones Pub**, 843 East Baltimore Pike Kennett Square, PA 19438. Located in the Shoppes at Longwood Village where there is plenty of parking for your classic or modern car.

While you're in the area, be sure to check out nearby attractions like Longwood Gardens <https://longwoodgardens.org/>, The Brandywine Museum of Art <https://www.brandywine.org/>, The Brandywine Revolutionary War Battlefield <https://www.brandywinebattlefield.org/> or the quaint antique shops scattered throughout the region. It's a great way to experience the beauty and history of this one-of-a-kind region!




